lowa State University participates in the Big 12 Faculty Fellowship Program which offers funding to faculty for travel to institutions affiliated through the Big 12 Athletics Conference. The goal of the program is the exchange of ideas and collaboration on scholarly efforts among faculty and across institutions. Faculty visits are ordinarily for one to two weeks, but longer visits are possible. Faculty, departments, and units may also seek to host a colleague from another Big 12 institution on our campus.
